Called to Community

As we live into the longest and warmest days of the year, over and over we are reminded that we are part of wider communities of life. Graduations remind us that we are part of high school communities, and college communities. Outdoor summer concerts bring together those who love music. Family reunions remind us of the breadth and depth of our extended families, and of our connections to the wider human family.

This month at St. Paul's we not only remind ourselves that we are a living part of a community of faith, but that faith is a community activity.

So on June 1, we are honoring our graduates in worship and in fellowship. On June 7, we are hosting a Community Block Party for our neighbors.

On Pentecost Sunday, June 8, we are reminded that our faith community and all of Christian communities are empowered by the Holy Spirit. And so we worship in red and share Communion with our neighbors in covenant from St. Paul's Lutheran, and then enjoy a Potluck Pentecost Picnic together.

It is appropriate to end the month of June with opportunities to reflect on stories of God calling isolated and lonely people into service and community: Elijah, who tells God that "I'm the only faithful person left, and they want to take my life too," and Elisha, who loses his close mentor, Elijah, and is called to take up Elijah's mantle (coat) and legacy, and make his living God's wisdom and love known to a new generation.

Sanctuary Renovations

The June 29th worship service will conclude with some reorganization in preparation for Sanctuary renewal, including new flooring, several coats of paint, a revised pew placement plan, updated audio/video system, revisions to choir lofts, and other physical and electrical changes.

Work in the Sanctuary requires the temporary removal of pews to the adjacent Narthex area, starting early Monday, June 30. We aim to begin the choir loft revisions and some other tasks even before the pew work is completed. Volunteers for various "work crews" similar to those from when the church was built over 40 years ago are needed. These crews will assist in completing tasks prior to the painters beginning mid-July.

We expect to return to the Sanctuary by mid-August, with weekly worship services held in the Social Hall or outdoors until then.

Sunday Morning Intergenerational Faith Discussions: Another Way

Jesus often confronted the world around him with another way of being and by his example we are reminded that God always invites us to re-imagine who we are and how we do things. Safe Sanctuary Response Team

St. Paul's first adopted a "Safe Church Policy" in June of 2009. Then in 2014, under the guidance of the Samaritan Counseling Center, now known as Safe Communities, our policy was expanded & revised to be called the "Safe Sanctuary Policy - A Policy Prohibiting Abuse, Exploitation, and Harassment of Children, Youth, and Adults."

The Safe Sanctuary Response Team is charged with administering the policy and carrying through on its directives such as, assuring that those who work with children & youth have current PA Child Abuse & Criminal Record certifications, keeping record of individuals who have keys to access the church, developing covenants & supervision for known sexual offender who wish to participate in worship services and Christian education, and periodically educating the congregation about child abuse awareness and relevant aspects of the policy as it relates to the life of our church and faith.

Over the years the portion of St. Paul's policy which has been questioned the most addresses "Providing Community for Known Sexual Offenders." It states in part that, *Individuals who have been adjudicated by a court or child protective services findings as sexual offenders and/or have admitted to past sexual abuse of children and are willing to abide by the guidelines set forth in this policy, are welcome to attend worship services and adult educational activities. Such individuals are hereafter referred to as "known sexual offenders" of offenders.* As Christians, the conundrum we face is showing mercy, forgiveness, or grace to a known sexual offender while continuing to support victims of abuse and protect those who participate in the life of the church from abusive situations.

St. Paul's shows mercy by even having a means for an offender to participate in worship services and adult education. Many congregations still refuse to accept a known sexual offender into the life of their church. However, mercy does not mean there are no boundaries around someone. It's important to recognize that for many victims of childhood sexual abuse, the social/psychological/relationship/medical and other consequences last for a lifetime. There is no real "end" or erasure of what happened, even though healing can help someone to bind up the wounds. There is no end-time of the pain for many victims. We show mercy by supporting their healing process and continuing to hold not just their own offenders accountable, but also any offender that comes into a church where victims are (often quietly and without disclosure) worshipping.

Many people believe the phrase "forgive and forget" command that comes from the Bible. It does not! One does not completely forget an offense when forgiving. In fact, trying to deny that an act of abuse happened can actually intensify the memory of what a victim is trying to forget. Christ-like forgiveness for human beings means that we will not hold anger, bitterness, or hostility "over the person's head." Instead of trying to literally forget a memory, the goal is to be released from the unhealthy emotional tie it has on a victim. Even when an offender is forgiven by their victim and/or their indirect victims, it does not necessarily remove the consequences of the offense.

Grace does not deny the seriousness of the offense or the need for carefulness. Research indicates that lifetime reoffending rates are at least 40% and some studies show much higher; this holds true even when including offenders that are "treated." While we are to avoid vengeance, we are to seek justice for those who have been wronged. Even though someone may be forgiven by God, they will still face the consequences of their offense and are still accountable to others for their behavior. St. Paul's policy allows for careful grace to be extended to known sexual offenders when they acknowledge the wrong they have done, accept responsibility for their actions, and are willing to engage in a Sexual Offender Covenant for Participation in the Congregation.
