Greetings and Announcements (responsive)

One: In Advent, we anticipate God coming in Christ to make it clear that God's love is for all persons: persons of every race, culture, or color; persons of all sexual orientations, gender expressions and identities; persons of all ages and abilities; persons of every legal, economic, and marital status. All persons whom the world would say there is "no room at the inn." God has come into the world as Jesus, is present as the Spirit of Christ, and is coming again as the risen Christ, because God delights in each and every one of you.

All: Thanks be to God!

So we as a community that seeks to worship, sing, pray, fellowship, serve, give, grow, and live in faith, invite each of you to fully participate, share, and lead.

LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES: REPENTANCE (RESPONSIVE, INSPIRED BY MATTHEW 3:1-12)

This is the season to repent. This is the day to confess our sins.

We confess, O God, that we are happy to name our sins but reluctant to release them, glad to aspire to righteousness but challenged to live it.

Keep your candles lit. Offer your willingness in hope.

Too long, O God, we have decried the pit of vipers but reserved our own venom for use. Too long, we have rinsed in the water but avoided the baptism of your fire.

By the light of Advent, we repent as we wait for Emmanuel. (The second Advent candle is lit.)

*CALL TO WORSHIP (RESPONSIVE)

*An asterisk indicates when the people stand in body or spirit.

One: The Reign of God is drawing near:

All: The prophet calls us to change our lives!

Prepare the way for the Lord:

A just and peaceful path!

Welcome one another, for Christ welcomes you:

For the glory of God!

*OPENING PRAYER (TOGETHER)

Almighty God, we seek relief from the unrest of our daily lives. You, who offer peace and justice in a single hand, are our redeemer. Allow us, God, to unfold like a seed in your palm. With each breath, allow us to inhale the power of your sacred word, and exhale the turmoil within. Allow us to grow toward you, the light of peace. Amen.

*SINGING TOGETHER

"O Come, O Come, Emmanuel"

INTRODUCTION

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (RESPONSIVE)

Holy One, have mercy.

Oh God, you call us to collaborate in community to prepare the way your Reign, but we neither trust nor honor the gifts of others.

Christ, have mercy.

Oh God, you call us to be full of joyful confidence to prepare the way for your Reign, but we burden ourselves with anxiety and fear.

Holy One, have mercy.

(a moment of silent prayer)

Forgive us, O God, and lead us in the ways of patience, community and joy.

ASSURANCE OF GOD'S LOVE

Hear the good news: the risen Christ is present with us, forgiving our weakness, rebuilding our relationships, restoring our joy. Our Redeemer will never stumble or disappoint.

Praise be to God!

*Passing of the Peace

(As a sign of our deep fellowship and communion with God and with one another, let us personally greet one another with a handshake or peace sign and bless one another with the peace that comes from being in Christ.)

God will speak peace to God's people, to those who turn to God in their hearts, and with their feet and hands.

The peace of Christ be with you.

And also with you.

Let us share the peace of Christ with one another.

HEBREW SCRIPTURE READING

ISAIAH 11:1-10

The prophet Isaiah has a vision of the peaceful kingdom that God intends. Our reading from Isaiah begins.

- ¹¹ A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
- ² The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
- ³ His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see or decide by what his ears hear,

- ⁴ but with righteousness he shall judge for the poor and decide with equity for the oppressed of the earth;
- he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.
- ⁵ Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist and faithfulness the belt around his loins.
- ⁶ The wolf shall live with the lamb; the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the lion will feed together, and a little child shall lead them.
- ⁷ The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.
- ⁸ The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den.
- on all my holy mountain, for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.
- ¹⁰ On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

The grass withers, the flower fades, but the Word of God endures forever. (*Isaiah 40:8*)

PSALM 72:1-7, 18-19 (PARAPHRASED)

The psalmist prays for a world shaped by God's justice and righteousness, that peace may flourish. Our responsive psalter reading begins.

Pulpit side: Give our leaders, our President, our Senators and Representatives, your justice, O God, and your righteousness to their children.

Lectern side: May our Governor and state legislators judge your people with righteousness, and your poor with justice.

Let the mountains give exuberant witness; shape the hills with the contours of right living.

Please stand up for the poor, help the children of the needy, come down hard on the cruel tyrants.

Outlast the sun, outlive the moon—age after age after age.

Be rainfall on cut grass, earth-refreshing rain showers.

Let righteousness burst into blossom and peace abound until the moon fades to nothing.

Blessed God, Israel's God, the one and only wonder-working God! Blessed always God's blazing glory! All earth brims with God's glory.

GOSPEL READING:

MATTHEW 3:1-12

The proclamation of John the Baptist.

In those days John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness of Judea, proclaiming, ² "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." ³ This is the one of whom the prophet Isaiah spoke when he said,

"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'"

⁴Now John wore clothing of camel's hair with a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region around the Jordan were going out to him, ⁶ and they were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸Therefore, bear fruit worthy of repentance, ⁹ and do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor," for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ¹⁰ Even now the ax is lying at the root

of the trees; therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹ "I baptize you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is more powerful than I, and I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹² His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."
